Recommendations :

- Fig 2: These properties need to be encouraged to install perimeter protection of some sort
- Fig 3: These young gum trees need to be cut out before they gwor any more as they will damage and compromise the perimeter security along the
- Fig 4: The barbed wire starnds have been cut and I understand it was done by whomever maintains the SANRAL reserve as they have no other way of accessing the area to cut it. We need to fid an alternative entry point that does not compromise the areas perimeter security like this..
- Fig 5: There is a dead tree across a section of the barbed wire fencing, this tree needs to be cut up and the broken fencing reinstated.
- **Fig 6:** A further section of the perimeter fencing being compromised by overgrowth of vegetation, this all needs to be cut back and maintained regularly so as to not compromise the areas security.
- Fig 7 & 8: This is our biggest concern the missing palisade pole and padlock on the inside gate is free untedetcted access in and out of the area and needs to be addressed as a matter of urgency. We have put a temporary padlock on the gate.
- Fig 9: This storm drain links the squatter camp across the road to the SANRAL reserve which is of great concern. I would suggest and engineer have a look at it and advise is there is anything that can be done to "human proof the tunnel.
