Urgent Crime Alert

Security service providers and SAPS across South Africa have reported an increase in crime over the last few months. Hijackings, follow-home robberies, and home and business burglaries have increased substantially.

24/7 Security Services urges all home and business owners to ensure that their security systems are in good working order, and regularly tested.

>> Test electronic systems at least once a month – alarm, electric fence, beams, batteries and panic buttons.

>> Ensure that you manage your Digi-pad code – the code should be changed at least once a month, whenever somebody has used the code to gain access to your property, or when an employee leaves.

>> Ensure that outside beams and perimeter fences are activated as soon as it gets dark.

>> Walk the perimeter of your property and inspect all fences, gates and walls. Ensure that there are no weak spots where criminals can gain entry. >> Ensure that all doors and windows are securely closed and locked before you leave the property - this includes outbuildings and garages. Ensure that burglar bars are secure and that safety gates are locked.

>> Criminals are wary of well-lit properties. Ensure that you have good outdoor lighting that switches on at night. Motion sensor lights are always a good investment.

>> Alert the 24/7 Command Centre when you are going away and ensure that all your contact details are correct. If you are going to be out of contact, appoint a trusted key holder who will be local for the duration of your absence.

Complexes & Estates

South Africa's POPI Act comes into effect on 1 July 2021. POPI is South Africa's data privacy law and it stands for the Protection of Personal Information Act, 2013. It governs when and how organisations collect, use, store, delete and otherwise handle personal information.

Community housing schemes have until 30 June 2021 to ensure complete compliance with the Protection of Personal Information (POPI) Act.

The regulations require housing schemes to have:

- A POPI policy
- Amended the rules of the scheme to comply with POPI
- An information officer who is the POPI oversight representative of the scheme
- POPI agreements with stakeholders who have access to the personal information of owners and tenants

24/7 Security urges all complexes, estates and other housing schemes to ensure that they are POPI compliant by 30 June 2021.

Load Shedding

Priority is given to panic signals during load shedding - AC fails and low battery signals are managed via SMS, and no calls are made to clients in order to assist with speeding up processing.

- **4** Ensure that your driveway is well lit and clear of shrubbery where criminals can hide.
- 5 Keep flashlights and extra batteries in your home and car in case of an emergency.
- **6** Test your electric fence and panic alarms regularly.
